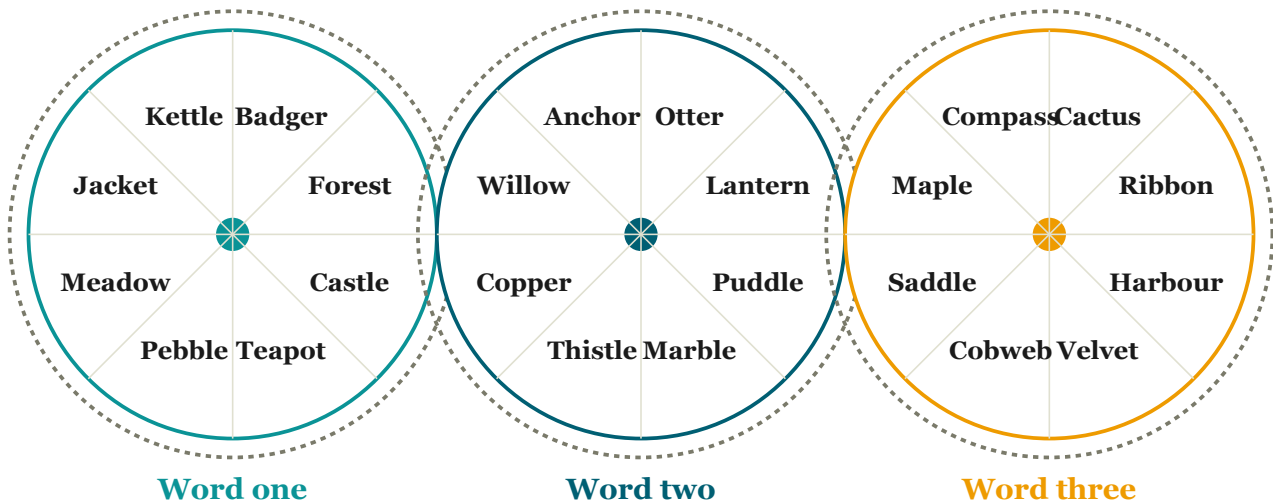


Strong Password Wheel

Ages 7–11 · cut-and-make

Cut out the three word wheels and pin them in the middle so they spin. Turn each one to pick a word, then join all three together, like teapot-badger-cactus. Three random words make a long password that is easy to remember and very hard to guess. This is the method the UK National Cyber Security Centre recommends.



Length beats tricks: three random words are stronger than a short word with numbers. Never share your password, not even with a best friend.
